(1) US Registration Open

Teams can now register for competitions. Sites are still being added.

Any team wishing to register for a workshop in January or February must be registered and fee paid. For Michigan teams, if your preferred site is full or not registered, and another site is not available, you can register your team for the "Michigan_Pre-Registration" site in order to pay the registration fee to be eligible to attend the workshops. Once other sites open, we can easily transfer your team to the new site.
