(7) LTU Scholarship Opportunity for all Robofest Participants

High School Juniors and Seniors who have participated in Robofest at any time and who are planning to attend LTU, could earn a \$3,000 renewable scholarship (Total of \$12,000). New for 2018, teams will have a second chance to qualify for the World Championship. Michigan teams who participate in local qualifiers will be invited back to compete in one of several small Michigan Invitational Events (10-12 teams) in the CS Robotics Lab during the week of April 23, 2018 instead of one large Michigan Championship.
